- Condiment bottles (i.e. ketchup)
- Gallon water jugs
- Juice jugs
- Liquor bottle
- Plastic milk jugs
- Shampoo, conditioner, soap bottles (pump removed, normal cap ok)
- Soda and water bottle

- CLEAN paper take-out bags (no grease, crumbs)
- Cup tray (i.e. Starbucks, McDonalds)
- Envelopes with window
- Envelopes without window
- Junk mail and flyers
- Magazines
- Manila envelopes
- Newspaper
- Newspaper inserts
- Notebook paper and paper cover (no metal wire)
- Packing paper
- Paper egg carton
- Paperback books (small amounts – rip book apart)
- Phonebook (small amounts – rip book apart)
- Postcards (natural fiber paper only – not waxy)
- Printer/office paper
- Wrapping paper with NO foil, texture, glitter, etc.

- Cards with glitter, sparkles, velvet, etc.
