JP Morgan Chase	Not be in excess of 30% of the banks total assets as shown in the bank’s latest Call Report

*Park National Bank will also continue to be the active monies depository account for Ashland County.

The above listed amounts are what the county treasurer considers to be the maximum amounts she would have on deposit at any one time with each financial institution. She will also use Star Ohio with maximum deposits of \$60,000,000.00.
