- I. County Commissioners are an arm of state government

 - B. County Commissioners handle business matters for the County budget and appropriate general fund money to:

 - 5. Clerk of Courts

 - 7. Fund operation of in whole or part:
 - a. County Jail

 - d. Veterans Service Office
 - e. OSU Extension
 - f. County Airport
 - g. Courts: Common Pleas, Probate, Juvenile, Municipal
