What is a solar eclipse?

- The moon passes between the sun and the earth, completely blocking the face of the sun
- The area where the moon's shadow covers the sun completely is called the path of totality
- The Greater Cleveland Metropolitan Area is within the path of totality



When is the solar eclipse?

- April 8, 2024
- Northeast Ohio
 - Eclipse will begin at 1:59pm (EDT)
 - Totality will happen at ~ 3:15 pm & last between 3-4 minutes (depending on location)
 - Eclipse will end at 4:28pm

During the event

- Ensure you have proper eyewear for eclipse viewing. Beware of counterfeit glasses that have not been safety tested
- Large crowds are expected, some of whom will leave at the end of the totality, creating adverse traffic conditions
